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## Keynote speakers





**Beth Jones** *Head of Career Programmes, Gatsby Foundation* 

Beth Jones is Head of Career Programmes for the Education team at the Gatsby Foundation. Gatsby is committed to securing good career guidance for all young people, building STEM skills in the workforce, technical education reform, and science and maths in schools.

Beth leads the team developing policy and programmes to improve career guidance for young people, adults and parents. This includes activity with schools and colleges, work that is shaped by Gatsby Benchmarks for Good Career Guidance. Beth commissions research, builds partnerships, manages innovative pilots, and looks to embed activity into national policy. Before joining Gatsby, Beth worked for several years running projects for education charities. Beth has also held several positions on advisory boards across the sector and has been a governor for a group of London schools.



**Ryan Gibson** Senior Adviser: Careers, Gatsby Foundation

Ryan is Senior Adviser for Careers at the Gatsby Foundation. He is seconded to Gatsby from a position of National System Leader for Careers at one of England's largest Multi-Academy Trusts. An experienced senior leader in education, Ryan worked as a member of the Skills Team at the North East Local Enterprise Partnership, developing the education and skills agenda and establishing 'North East Ambition', a careers network of over 200 schools, colleges and businesses. In 2015 Ryan successfully led the original national pilot of the Gatsby Benchmarks, working closely with schools, colleges, employers, government officials and supporting national strategy and roll out. Ryan has been recognised previously as UK Career Educator of the Year by the Career Development Institute and was awarded the Sinnott Fellowship for his work connecting education and business. He is a member of several advisory boards, has supported the development of careers provision internationally and is Chair of Governors at a Primary School in the North East.



**Tom Corry** *Director of Careers, Bourne Education Trust* 

Tom is the Director of Careers within the Bourne Education Trust, providing oversight and support for Primary, Secondary and SEN schools. He has worked with schools to embed the CDI framework into their curriculum building a "through journey" for students as they transition through education from Early Years through to their Post-16 destinations.

Tom is a firm believer in collaboration with all partners, and has worked closely with local business and enterprise to develop an award winning learning programme with Brooklands Museum.



**Tristram Hooley** *Professor of Career Education, University of Derby* 

Tristram Hooley is a Professor at the Inland Norway University of Applied Sciences and Professor of Career Education at the University of Derby. In these roles he focuses on research and teaching on career and career guidance. He is an internationally renowned researcher and evaluator who works with a range of research methods to explore careers, the labour market and the practice of career guidance. He has taught, consulted, lectured and conducted research on four continents. Tristram has published 11 books, 29 book chapters, 29 peer reviewed articles and over a hundred research reports and other publications. 
